Celebrating 20 Years BlueSky is turning 20 years old in March! BlueSky's first students

started in the fall of 2000 and since then, we have grown to an enrollment of about 525 full time students! Our graduating classes are typically around 120 students each year. We would love to celebrate this 20 year milestone with you and the BlueSky community this summer in conjunction with our school relocation. We will be moving into our new school site in Bloomington this July. If you are interested and/or have experience with organizing fundraising or community events, please contact me. We would like to begin preparations for an open house celebration to occur this summer or early fall. 20-21 School Year Enrollment

BlueSky counselors are preparing to begin scheduling students for their 20-21 fall courses and will be emailing out information about this

in early March. This will likely include choosing elective options for many students. Click here to see a list of courses that will be offered next school year and be sure to communicate with your counselor about your students current credit status. In addition, we are now accepting new enrollments for 20-21. BlueSky will once again be offering summer school courses for our students which begins June 8th. Information about enrolling in this

program will be emailed to students and parents in late April or early May. Students who enroll in summer school typically are those behind in credits or who are in need of retaking a course. In order to be eligible for free summer school courses, students must have passed at least 1/2 of their 2nd semester courses. For those students looking to advance their studies or those who are not currently enrolled at BlueSky, there will be a tuition based option. Turning on some music

Negative thoughts, actions, and emotions raise your anxiety level. Positive thoughts, actions, emotions, and using calming tools lowers your anxiety level.
