

**Internet Security:** Technology is a wonderful tool for communicating and information sharing, but like all tools children learn to use, parents must provide supervision and limits to ensure children have a safe and rewarding experience. During March, <u>Safe Harbor</u> will be presenting information about internet safety to BlueSky's oth graders during their advisory time. These sessions will be recorded for all 6-12th grade students and parents to view at a later date. We will send a follow up communication to let you know when they are available for your viewing. For now, here are some sites for you to review with your child to help keep them safe.

Parent/Family Sites (MDE)

- The Facebook <u>Put a Stop to Bullying</u> site includes tools, tips and programs that help people stand up for themselves and each other. There are also resources for parents, teens and educators on the site. Facebook also has <u>protocols for reporting</u> suicidal threats or content.
- The <u>Microsoft site Safety and Security</u> <u>Center</u> has Internet safety tips for parents and families, including a section entitled "Help Kids Stay Safer Online."
- <u>i-SAFE</u>, the website of the Internet Safety Education, is a non-profit foundation for Internet safety education. It is dedicated to educating and empowering young people to safely, responsibly and productively use the Internet.
- <u>NetSafe</u> is a website based in New Zealand which provides practical information and tips on types and sources of sexually explicit content, ways that inappropriate material can reach children and teens, the threat of cyber stalking and other issues involving Internet safety.
- <u>Common Sense Media</u> has several family tip sheets that address multiple age groups.
- <u>Cyber Safety Cop</u> provides tip sheets, advice and blogs on cyberbullying and internet safety.
- <u>Web Wise</u> provides how-tos, publications and "explainers" on apps and social media.
- <u>National Child Protection Training</u> <u>Center</u> provides trainings, handouts, education and prevention awareness for
- Internet safety.
  <u>Safe Kids provides posts</u>, safety advice and guides to parents and students on
