Gifted & Talented Program Plan	Notes: Dan and Cathy recently updated and reviewed plan What does enrichment for a gifted student look like at BlueSky? Curriculum compacting: allowing students to skip certain parts of the curriculum to advance. In place of work that is 'skipped' student would replace with independent study, projects, advanced study (this is backed by research) There are strict criteria for qualifying We need to find a better way to 'tag' students that have added this to their application; we need to first have a way to confirm this We are asked at middle school to accelerate a student often in math Students need to prove with test scores that they can handle the advanced coursework or have previously been placed in advanced courses "My student is gifted, how will you support my student?" We review documentation from previous school, our gifted committee will review the information to discuss a plan and work with the family - plans may include any combination of acceleration, enrichment and PSEO Can we refer students in the future? We can talk further about that as an option, currently pre-identification is based on test scores As we develop new classes, both Tier 1 intervention and enrichment need to be considered for units Committee is: admin, counselor, sw, advisor, teacher of that grade level Actions: Staff need future training on the updates that are made to the plan (i.e. curriculum compacting)

	they could not keep up with the revisions as working on plan How does this impact our teachers and programming? We will need to schedule training for the WIDA Can do philosophy; this will benefit all students Clarified services based on ACCESS levels The EL students do have outside challenges and some of the strategies may not apply, but wanted to include a wide variety and options Was broken down by speaking and listening; reading and writing Services provided by EL program are outlined, along with EA support available Long term EL students would have an automatic intervention referral to help further identify needs Our current process has not necessarily been triggering why some students are not making progress Many of the students and families do not want EL services The new EL lead at MDE is working to incorporate trauma informed practices Prioritizing speaking would be helpful in our setting, to help students better communicate with teachers and about content Could a speech class be helpful with this need? This could be a future additional course
