State testing is just around the corner. All fulltime students in grades 6, 7, 8, 10, and 11 are expected to participate in statewide testing. We have 16 testing sites across the state. Testing will take place between April 8th and April 18th with makeup days available the following week. All students will be assigned to the location closest to where they live. Please check your emails in the next 1-2 weeks for more information about your child's testing location and date. Let us know as soon as possible if your child cannot make it to their assigned testing location on their assigned date so we can reschedule. You can support your child by encouraging them to get a good night's sleep the night before, and eating a healthy breakfast the day of testing. If your child is taking more than one test, consider sending a bag lunch that they can eat during a scheduled break.



They provide health education and exercise plans to help clients improve their respiratory, circulatory, and other systems. MCA Testing

We are quickly approaching Minnesota's annual testing window for the Minnesota Comprehensive Assessments (MCAs). Testing will take place between April 8th-26th at sites across Minnesota. If additional testing is needed, makeup sessions will be scheduled at our Bloomington, MN campus between April 22nd- April 25th

Your students testing site information will be emailed and mailed by the second week of March. If for any reason you cannot test at your originally assigned location, please reach out to <u>reschedule</u>.

Reschedule MCA testing

The following is grade level specific information

- Students in the 6th & 7th grade take reading and math. Both reading and math tests can be completed in one day. Students wishing to complete testing in two days should reach out to Danielle Sanders no later than 1 week prior to the testing date.
- Students in the **8th grade** take reading, math and science and are recommended to test over two days but can be completed in one day. Students wishing to complete testing
- in one day should reach out to **Danielle** Sanders no later than 1 week prior to the testing date.
- Students in the **10th grade**, one day of testing for your reading test. Students currently enrolled in Biology B will also need to take the science test. Both reading and science tests can be completed in one day.
- Students in the **11th grade**, one day of testing for your math test. Students currently enrolled in Biology B will also need to take the science test. Both math and science tests can be completed in one day.

Testing Dates & Locations

Please bring the following items with you:

- Headphones (can be used for Math and
- Science tests) • Calculator (11th grade students only)
- Pencils • A snack, if you would like (must be
- consumed outside of test room) You will receive attendance credit for

testing. Please remember you are still responsible for keeping up with your classwork for the week and maintaining your proper number of assignments.

Cell phones are not allowed in the testing center. You may bring your phone with you, but you will be required to leave it on silent. We reserve the right to request that you give your phone to the proctor upon arrival, it will be returned to you when you complete testing.



As of right now, the United States Department of Education is requiring states to proctor state testing. BlueSky strongly encourages your child's participation for this test but recognizes that each family will need to make the decision to test at a personal level. Before making a decision on if your child will participate in the MCAs, please consider the following:

- The results from these tests provide detailed information to your child's teachers that helps guide instruction and improve your child's learning. Teachers and support staff frequently use assessment data to make informed decisions about how best to meet individual student needs; not participating in statewide testing limits the academic information available.
- The results also provide you with information on your student's growth and progress. Test scores are a good indicator of your child's College and Career Readiness. Recent legislation also requires Minnesota State Colleges and Universities to utilize MCA reading and mathematics scores as a factor in determining course enrollments. This means your student could bypass course placement testing when registering for classes. Eighth grade students may not be eligible to participate in Postsecondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) in 10th grade if they do not take the MCAs.
- Assessment scores are used by our authorizer and the State in determining the effectiveness of our programs. When students don't participate in state testing our results may become invalid due to low overall participation or district wide results that do not accurately reflect BlueSky's student body. Students that don't participate are scored as not proficient, having a significant negative impact on BlueSky's performance measures. This can potentially impact our ability to meet established school goals and result in our school not meeting contractual obligations with our school authorizer.
